SUBJECT: Adequate Public Facilities Report for Schools – April 2, 2012

Background:

The Zoning Ordinance states in Article 7-1.05 D.1 that “Schools are adequate when all public elementary and secondary schools which will serve the proposed residential subdivision or residential development will accommodate the pupil yield from that residential subdivision or residential development without exceeding 100 percent of the rated capacity of any of those schools.”

The Calvert County Zoning Ordinance, Section 7-1.05 E states, “If facilities are identified as having inadequate capacity, the Department of Planning and Zoning shall notify the Planning Commission and the County Commissioners.”

Parcels that meet certain criteria listed in the Zoning Ordinance are exempt from Adequate Public Facilities (APF) Requirements for Schools (Section 7-1.05. F). Determination of school adequacy is not required for non-residential subdivisions or age-restricted housing communities. The Zoning Ordinance limits the delay of final approval of a residential subdivision or residential development to seven years.

Discussion:

Since the Fall 2011 Report, two schools have changed capacity status: Mount Harmony Elementary and Huntingtown High Schools are now below 100% APF rated capacity. Calvert, Huntingtown and Patuxent High Schools are below their 100% APF rated capacities. Northern High School remains above 100% rated capacity.

Of Calvert County’s 23 public schools, three (3) are deemed inadequate since enrollments exceed 100% of the County’s Adequate Public Facilities (APF) rated capacities for those schools. These were three of the five schools that were over capacity in the fall. The following one (1) elementary school, one (1) middle school and one (1) high school have inadequate capacities:

Beach Elementary	116.1%
Northern Middle	105.6%
Northern High	121.4%

The attached chart shows the Spring 2012 enrollments compared with APF rated capacities for each school. The Calvert County Public School staff provided the enrollments for February 2012, and the Career and Technology Academy attendance (see attachments). The number of elementary school classrooms, the number of middle and high school teaching stations were provided by Calvert County Public Schools in October 2011, and do not change for this report. The chart showing the calculation for each school's APF rated capacity is attached. The calculations for determining the elementary, the middle, and high school APF rated capacities are specified in the Calvert County Zoning Ordinance.

Maps are provided for elementary, middle, and high school levels and the report includes a composite map of all school levels that are over 100% capacity (attached). The maps are for illustrative purposes. The Board of Education's written descriptions of school district boundaries determine which school districts serve a residential subdivision or residential development. If there is a question regarding which school district serves a parcel, the Board of Education makes the final determination.

Elementary Schools

Of the 13 elementary schools, one is over 100% APF capacity: Beach (116.1%). With one exception, the remaining elementary schools are below 90%. One elementary school, Mt. Harmony, is over 90% but less than 100% capacity.

Middle Schools

One of the six middle schools, Northern Middle, is over capacity at 105.6%. The remaining middle schools are less than 90% capacity.

High Schools

One high school, Northern High School, is over 100% capacity. The remaining three high schools are between 97% to 99% capacity.

Student Transfer Analysis:

In August 2011, the County Commissioners requested staff include an evaluation of the impact of student transfers on the county school capacities in future Adequate Public Facilities Reports. In this report, Staff included a chart, entitled *Enrollments Compared with APF Rated Capacities Transfer Students*, evaluating transfer student impacts by subtracting the number of incoming students and adding the number of outgoing students. The chart indicates that the same three schools would be over capacity if transfers were factored out. Beach Elementary, Northern Middle and Northern High School would be over capacity. Thus, the transfer student policy does not impact whether a school district is opened or closed to the recording of residential subdivisions or residential development.




