SUBJECT: Adequate Public Facilities Report for Schools – November 1, 2014

Background

Adequate public facilities (APF) regulations are a growth management tool that restricts development in areas where facilities are inadequate. Calvert County adopted APF regulations for schools and roads in 1988. The Calvert County Zoning Ordinance states in Article 7-1.05 D.1 that “Schools are adequate when all public elementary and secondary schools which will serve the proposed residential subdivision or residential development will accommodate the pupil yield from that residential subdivision or residential development without exceeding 100 percent of the rated capacity of any of those schools.” Article 7-1.05 E states, “If facilities are identified as having inadequate capacity, the Department of Planning and Zoning shall notify the Planning Commission and the County Commissioners.”

The Zoning Ordinance limits the delay of final approval of a residential subdivision or residential development due solely to the lack of adequate school capacity to seven years from the date of preliminary approval. The calculations for determining the elementary, middle, and high school APF rated capacities are specified in the Zoning Ordinance. Determination of school adequacy is not required for non-residential subdivisions or age-restricted housing communities. Parcels that meet certain criteria listed in the Zoning Ordinance are exempt from Adequate Public Facilities (APF) Requirements for Schools (Article 7-1.05. F).

Discussion

Three of Calvert County’s public schools are deemed to have inadequate capacity since enrollments exceed 100% of the County’s Adequate Public Facilities (APF) rated capacities for those schools. The following two elementary schools and one high school have inadequate APF capacities:

Beach Elementary	104.7%
Windy Hill Elementary	100.4%
Northern High	120.5%

Since the Spring 2014 report, the status of the following three schools has changed. Mount Harmony Elementary’s and Northern Middle’s enrollments decreased below 100% of the APF capacity; these two schools are no longer over APF capacity and the school districts are no longer closed to the final recording of residential subdivisions and residential site development plans. Windy Hill Elementary’s enrollment increased above 100% of the APF capacity; this school is now over APF capacity and the school district is closed to the final recording of residential subdivisions and residential site development plans.

The attached chart shows the Fall 2014 enrollments compared with APF rated capacities for each school. The Calvert County Public School staff provided the enrollment counts, the Career and Technology Academy attendance, and updates to the number of elementary school classrooms and the number of middle and high school teaching stations. A chart showing the calculation for each school’s APF rated capacity is attached.

Maps showing elementary, middle, and high school district status and a composite map of all school levels that are over 100% capacity are attached. The maps are for illustrative purposes. The Calvert County Public Schools’ writ-

ten descriptions of school district boundaries determine which school districts serve a residential subdivision or residential development. If there is a question regarding which school district serves a parcel, the Calvert County Public Schools makes the final determination.

Elementary Schools

Of the 13 elementary schools, two are over 100% APF capacity. Beach Elementary is over capacity at 104.7%. Windy Hill Elementary is over capacity at 100.4%. The remaining elementary schools are below 95%. Earlier this spring, the Calvert County Board of Education adopted a redistricting plan that changed district boundaries for three elementary schools: Beach, Plum Point and Windy Hill. The new boundaries for these school districts are included in the maps for this report.

Middle Schools

None of the six middle schools are over 100% APF capacity. Two middle schools, Northern Middle and Windy Hill Middle, are over 90%. The other four middle schools are below 90%.

High Schools

Of the four high schools, one is over 100% APF capacity. Northern High School is over capacity at 120.5%. Two high schools are over 90% but less than 100% capacity, and the other is less than 90% capacity.

Schools Approaching 100% Capacity

The number of lots/units that may be recorded is limited based upon the pupil yield by school level and housing type, which are provided in the Zoning Ordinance.

Student Transfer Analysis

In August, 2011, the County Commissioners requested staff include in future reports an analysis of the impact of the Calvert County Public School's policy regarding student transfers on the APF school capacities. For Fall 2014, if the net effect of student transfers were taken into account, student transfers would have an impact on whether a school district were opened or closed to the recording of residential subdivisions or residential development. Student transfers have no impact on the status of Windy Hill Elementary and Northern High; they are over capacity and remain overcapacity with student transfers. Student transfers would impact the status of two elementary schools and one middle school. Beach Elementary would be under capacity instead of over. Mount Harmony Elementary and Northern Middle would be over capacity instead of under capacity. Refer to the *Enrollments Compared with APF Rated Capacities, Student Transfers*.






